The initiative was taken by the Rector Fr. Emmanuel and the community members supported the venture. Thanks to the Benefactors and the well-wishers who supported us financially.















FAREWELL, DEAR BROTHER




On September 17, during the meal time, Fr. Rector announced that our dear Dean and Principal, Bro. Christopher Rodrigo, has

At around 3.30pm on September 20, the whole aspirantate was filled with music and songs courtesy of the 7 bands composed of Aspirants for a Band Competition.




WELCOME HOME DEAR BROTHERS

This "Don Bosco Global Youth Film Festival" (DBGYFF), is scheduled to take place on 18 and 19 November 2021, in hundreds of locations in 134 countries around the world, in all time zones.

The festival, in fact, will have as its theme, the motto of the Strenna of the Rector Major for 2021, "Moved by Hope", and includes three categories to which young people from all over the world can submit their works: short films, animated videos and musical videos.

DBGYFF aims to become an annual feature and intends to be a film festival of global significance and a media event reaching out to a maximum audience. All those who wish to participate in DBGYFF can upload their work between 24 July and 30 September, 2021.



It is in fact interesting to see that our Past Pupils have already taken initiative in coming up with a short film for this film festival. We thank all those young people and Salesians who have taken this burden on their shoulders to represent our Vice Province, Sri Lanka. Let us make our young people become the ambassadors of Hope in our motherland.



# WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT FOR YOU

FR. NIROSHAN FERNANDO, SDB

My ordination day was an unforgettable peak point of my Call to Priesthood. I would call this experience as a God experience. During my final preparation for ordination I was uncertain whether to continue or not. So, during my final retreat I asked God for a sign. I was in the Philippines then. One day, during that retreat as I was walking in a beautiful garden, I noticed a quotation written in that garden. It said 'Don't be afraid to entrust your unknown future into the hands of the All knowing God'. This experience has become the reference point of my life always.

FR. CHALANA KALANGA, SDB

This anniversary is very heart-touching because I was born on 13th and this is my 13th priestly ordination anniversary. Thirteenth is the favourite number of Mother Mary; and, it goes without any explanation since you already know it. I take comfort in my priesthood, because it is daily transforming me into a good human person. According to Pope Francis, a priest's spirituality is embodied in the reality of everyday life. "His is a prophetic voice in the face of the oppression that tramples on the poor and the weak". This would be the biggest challenge in my life as I walk in this manner of life.



### FR. TERANCE VIRANTHA, SDB

After journeying for 13 years in my priestly life this is what I discovered and treasured within me. I too had enough experiences of people having such a magical heart. Let me narrate one such experience. This had happened in one of our camps with young people.

We named the programme Pitadeniya Trail Adventure. Though we named it such, it was indeed a life education with nature, an outbound adventure and leadership training programme for young people. We have selected the Pitadeniya Trail in Sinharaja forest in Aluthgama. As we were reaching our destination with much difficulty, suddenly the bus stopped three kilometers away in the middle of the forest as we couldn't move any further. Due to the heavy rain the last few days Aluthgama had the road was too bad and we had no choice. I remained with the driver to search for a place to park the vehicle while others started moving with their heavy luggages.

As I was busy searching for a place to park the vehicle I got a call. Due to the coverage problem it was not at all clear but I sensed the girl who called me was crying. I got really scared and tried to call her and the others but in vain.



As I had no choice I started walking towards them leaving the driver alone. Unfortunately, I found no one on the way. As I reached the place I saw the girl who called me. Then only I came to know the story. Among the 40 young participants just one boy after leaving the things he just walked back for something. He thought, it seems, at least I would be there.





As he came back he saw these five girls who were waiting, unable to move with the heavy luggages they had. With his support they reached the place safely. In one of the discussions, the girls solemnly proclaimed this young man had not just 2 strong hands but a beautiful heart too. I would say a magical heart which made him walk back.

Without wasting any more words let me conclude with a short dialogue between the Lord and a youngster. In the place of the youngster we can put just anybody, even you and I. Lord give me a theme so that I may do my part.

What you need is a heart not a theme to do your part, replied Lord with a smile.

Allow me to add

"what you need is a Magical Heart and nothing else to do your part".



### FR. SUSITH MILROY, SDB

I'm Fr. Susith Milroy SDB. I've been a Salesian for the past 21 years and a Priest for 13. I have been asked to pen these few lines sharing my prospects and experience as a Salesian-Priest today. I do this in three points:

First, amid the modern stirrings of opinion, there is a tendency to express commonly, that we have many priests in the Church, but less priesthood. The causes of this public mentality are varied, sometimes due to a moment of our own weakness or fragility. The decrease in vocations to the priesthood is to be found everywhere. Individuals, families and society are losing their sense of God, all that is holy, the esteem for the Church, faith and sacraments. The Pandemic aggravated all our troubles. Therefore there is a lot of need for vocation and formation of promotion our candidates to the Salesian way of life. Therefore, the Programmatic Action Plan of the GC 28 is crucial to our vocation.

Second, we are Salesian Priests. We are not secular. We all know that the "adjective" which defines us is primary, not an appendix to our life, but for a specific and original task: Salesian consecrated identity! This qualifies for some Salesians who are priests a specific "Priesthood" defined by Don Bosco. Here, our life is radical and focused. Our vocation and ministry deepen the mystery of Christ lived by Don Bosco.

We all aspire to this. Thus, I would say the past 21 years of my Salesian vocation qualified the 13 years of my priesthood. But, there is a danger that I see: the desire to be "secular!" while being a "Salesian". We must fight this temptation of giving up to perplexed and distracted worldly affairs of position, sometimes ministry itself and careerism fine-tuned by clericalism.

Third, as for all of us, I too don't have a personal list of external achievements memorials (which some priests crave), but a specific, Salesian, communitarian and evangelical identity to be cherished. Like all of you, I too lived the courage of faith in the spirit of Don Bosco for the young. We must always imitate the experience of the Good Shepherd laying down his life for the sheep (Jn 10,11). Like Christ, we must become the "Power of God" offering ourselves in sacrifice. We must be the sacrificial lamb, Sacerdos et hostia to our young people. Here the beauty and the mystery of the High Priest of Christ is manifested in our humble persons. Our liturgy becomes vibrant and the Gospel echoes the voice of Christ. The discovery of the sole intent on the things of God and the Church empower our prayer life as profoundly Salesian priestly and occupation.



### FR. SUSITH MILROY, SDB

Finally, we must grow in our "Salesian vocation", and therefore, we must be ready to give our best for the ongoing "Salesian formation". The quality of the initial formation is the bedrock of the excellence of ongoing formation. This is the architectural programme of the GC 28 at our doorstep. In all these years I tried for a growth in the Salesian-spiritual life related to the need for integration and integrity. I strive for the unity of Salesian life following Don Bosco in the fulfilment of my vocation. I continue to journey discovering the authentic spiritual programme of my external activities and interior life. Today, I understand that Salesian holiness is not about doing more and doing it better in a human way, but about being a "certain type of person" in the pedagogy of the preventive system; a person whose life has a definite direction, a goal, a unity of purpose about it. This is for me "the courage of faith" in Don Bosco. I wish you all the same! Let us discover the courage and the beauty of faith in Don Bosco! I recall to my brother priests the memorable words said to us during our ordination rite: "Know what you are doing, and imitate the mystery you celebrate: model your life on the mystery of the Lord's cross". I think that Don Bosco did this till the end of his life. He is our model!

### FR. RUWANTHA THIRIMANNE, SDB

On September 4th we celebrated the 13th anniversary of our ordination to the priesthood, in which I felt the presence of God's grace, beyond my own capability. In all of these years it is true that I have received more than I have given. So I take this opportunity to thank God, the Salesian congregation, my family and my community in Don Bosco Technical Center Negombo for their love, guidance, and all the more your patience with me. The words of St. Augustine keep on reminding me "To fall in love with God is the greatest of romances, to seek him the greatest adventure, to find him the greatest human achievement."
